The process is ingenious: municipal solid waste is blasted with steam until a synthetic gas – similar to natural gas – is formed. The end product can be used for power generation.

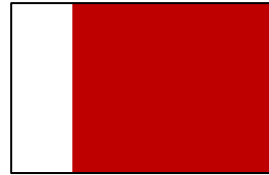
As the conversion takes place in an oxygen-free environment, there are no carbon dioxide emissions, meaning Elementa creates clean energy.
